YEARS OF

his is the first time that the Army Day Parade on 15 January is going to be held outside of Delhi. While it is always useful that other parts of India get to witness such pageantry on a scale equal to the national capital, there is a fundamental logistical reason why this should have been avoided. A week and a half later, the nation celebrates Republic Day with a grand military and cultural spectacle. The largest component of which is the Army contingents which would have practiced in Delhi for the event whilst also taking part in the 15 January Parade.

Now those contingents would have to wrap up their events, put all that gear and paraphernalia away, uptick to Delhi, pitch camp, and unwrap all of that once again. The sheer wear and tear of the equipment, not to mention the stress on soldiers and their contingent commanders, is an account that is very difficult to tabulate, but immediately tangible to the discerning eye. Coupled with the fact that budgetary allocations have been tightened in the recent past, this is an avoidable headache for the Army; which is also pretty much how the Army has been treated in the country.

As the weapon of last resort, the Army has in fact been used far too frequently for operations other than military. While it is understandable that some contingencies demand the organisation, skills, command and control, of an Army contingent in order to overcome the crisis. But it must be remembered that each deployment extracts something from the Army that has long-term ramifications. The extravaganza of an Army Day Parade in a city other than Delhi would provide an occasion to remember for those spectators lucky enough, but the headache caused to the troops must be borne in mind too.

Which is where the world of technological innovations comes in, both as a challenge but also as an aid to routine deployment. In the sphere of military operations alone, nothing has impacted more thoroughly and more consistently than an unmanned aerial vehicle, ubiquitously called the Drone. Since their first use for aerial reconnaissance, subsequently for taking out high-value targets in remote areas, and now in direct combat roles, the drone has truly come of age in any modern military. So much so that the numbers are proliferating more rapidly than was imaginable a few years back. A drone is now essential.

What was once considered an expensive video toy is finally acknowledged as a war-fighting tool of the highest importance. Little wonder that virtually every day there is an announcement of new entrants in the drone manufacturing sector. The more the merrier, for the competition will only make the products better for the user. And no user is more important than the armed forces, of which the largest component is the Army. China recently knocked on the Line of Actual Control in the Tawang sector, just as it has been doing for the past few years. Drones can provide enhanced coverage as well as non-lethal options.
