



anipur melted down socially in the first week of May 2023, and it hasn't been able to return to its previous pacific

state of being since then. In actual fact the social cleavages must have been in existence long before the date hangs as day of infamy for the country. For on that day society, civilians, came apart with a brutality not seen since the bigoted assaults on Kashmiri Pandits in early 1990. Plains versus hills, valley versus woodlander, native versus intruder, original versus tribal, and Manipur versus Myanmar. So the list of exclusivity goes on and on, endlessly expanding.

This exclusivity has yet not been adequately tackled by the state government, and it remains a deeply divided set up. In that sense it is simply mirroring the social conditions of Manipur as a whole. An initiative from Imphal with a modicum of integrity would have sent a message of unity and harmony. Any initiative would have sent a positive signal, but that, alas, has not been coming from the Government of Manipur. As a rule the initiative should always come from the ruling establishment which aspires to govern for all citizens, irrespective of any affiliation other than local residency.

Manipur's social breakdown is akin to a split, a civil war in some senses. When that is the condition, with civilians carrying arms, donning combat pattern clothing, and standing guard at village check posts, it really appears to be a civil war. And then it becomes a pattern, globally too, to pin blame on one party or the other. But the bitter truth is that any civil conflict, violent or otherwise, requires two to tango. So to blame one party over all others is a serious mistake which can only go on to prolong the problems, adding to the agony.

Manipur is a border state in one of India's most sensitive sectors. It may not garner the eyeballs that the border with Pakistan does, or as the Line of Actual Control issues

do with China, but this is no less important. There are vital security issues at stake here as well long term economic concerns that require immediate attention. While long running insurgencies surround the state, there is also the specter of transnational smuggling of narcotics from Myanmar, and beyond. And it is the beyond that is vitally important to India, for the economic future of the country lies eastward.

India needs to rapidly expand trade ties with countries to the east for that is where the future of global economic growth is expected to be focused. The energy and dynamism of South-East and East Asian economies is the envy of most around the world. So India must focus its energies in that direction, but before that can be a fruitful success story there is much to do in Manipur. The best trading points are across the Manipur border, and so it makes sense to develop the infrastructure accordingly. But it'll come to nothing if Manipur's social conditions remain fractured.
